Plans are required for all building types and shall be prepared by or under the direct supervision of an architect or engineer licensed pursuant to Act. No. 299 of the Public Acts of 1980, as amended and shall bear that architect's or engineer's signature and seal, except:

1. One and two family dwellings less than 3,500 square feet.
2. Alterations and repair work determined by the electrical official to be of a minor nature.
3. When an electrical system rating does not exceed 400 amps.
4. Work completed by a governmental subdivision or state agency costing less than \$15,000.00.

5. Applicant Signature

Section 23a of the State Construction Code Act of 1972, PA 230, MCL 125.1523A prohibits a person from conspiring to circumvent the licensing requirements of this state relating to persons who are to perform work on a residential structure. Violators of Section 23a are subject to civil fines.

6. Homeowner Affidavit

A permit shall become invalid if the authorized work is not commenced within six months after issuance of the permit or if the authorized work is suspended or abandoned for a period of six months after commencing the work. **A PERMIT WILL BE CANCELLED WHEN NO INSPECTIONS ARE REQUESTED AND CONDUCTED WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF THE DATE OF ISSUANCE OR THE DATE OF A PREVIOUS INSPECTION. 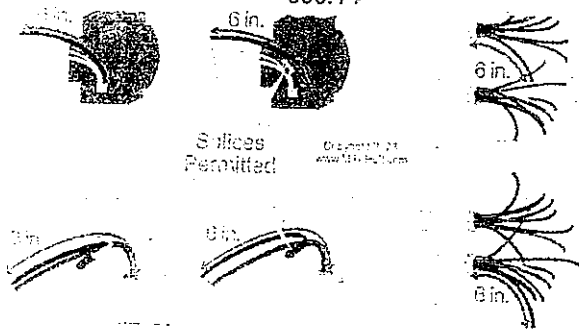

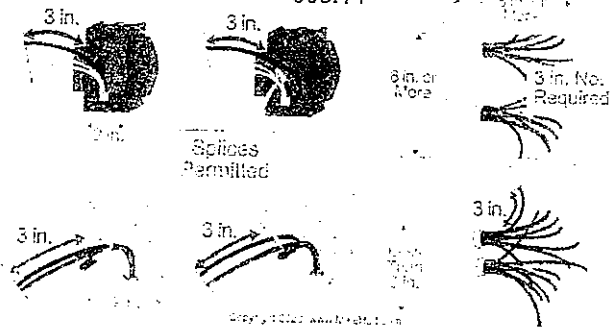

Conductor Length at Boxes At Least 6 in. 300.14

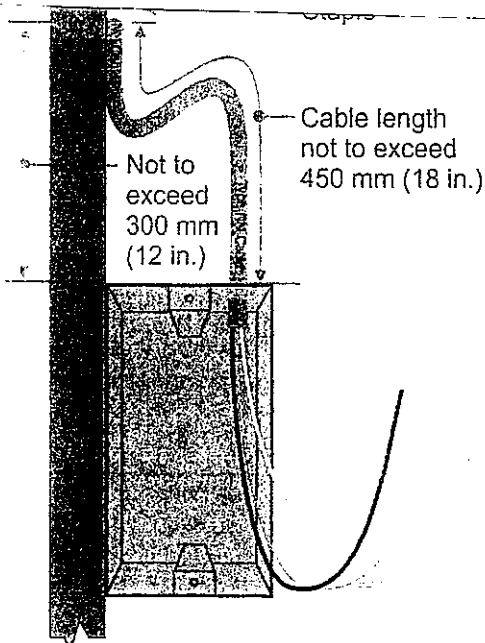


At least 6 in. of spliced or unspliced conductor, measured from the point in the box where the conductors enter the enclosure, must be provided for conductor splices or terminations.

Conductor Length at Boxes 3 in. Outside the Box 300.14



Boxes with openings of less than 8 in. must have at least 6 in. of conductor, measured from the point where the conductors enter the box, and at least 3 in. of conductor outside the box.

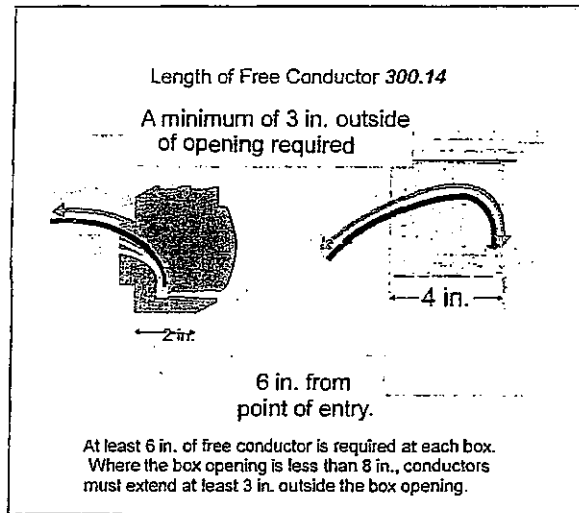


1.4 m (4½ ft) and within 300 mm (12 in.) of every cable entry into enclosures such as outlet boxes, junction boxes, cabinets, or fittings

300 mm (12 in.) measurement is still measured from the box to the securing method (staples; cable ties, straps, hangers, etc.), but cable length between the cable entry and the closest cable support must not exceed 450 mm (18 in.)

406.12 Tamper-Resistant Receptacles

MRC E4002.14

All 15- and 20-ampere, 125- and 250-volt non locking-type receptacles in areas specified in 406.12(1) through (7) must be listed tamper-resistant receptacles:

- (1) Dwelling units in all areas specified in 210.52 and 550.13;
- (2) Guest rooms and guest suites of hotels and motels;
- (3) Child care facilities
- (4) Preschools/elementary educational facilities;
- (5) **Waiting rooms, etc. in medical/dental offices;**
- (6) Places of waiting- transportation, gymnasiums, etc.;
- (7) Dormitories
